"We really enjoyed the Alan Barnhart video and his story of studying the bible in depth to discern God's view on money and then finding ways to practically live out these convictions in his life."

At the end of Term 1, our Stewardship Committee and Board Members took part in our first "Journey of Generosity" workshop. Below are some reflections from those that attended...

"You actually need to plan your life around what you believe in, we often think about stuff and have a heart for things but have no real plan on how to make it happen. Also not to wait to be able to do things, in your plan make it so you can start now with something achievable, because it's no good waiting for something to happen before you can act. It will prolong the ability to do anything as we may never get to the start line."

"What am I doing to train my Children/Grandchildren to be "Generous"? And not just givers but disciples....."

"If I trust Christ with my salvation, why do I not trust Him in all aspects of my life?"

"I was challenged to consider the "beliefs" I acquired about money from an early age, and how they impact me now. I came away from the day with a broader perspective on the material aspects of our lives, inspired by the faithful and radical lives of others, and reminded that God really is active in the world."

"The quote 'If you have something to eat, you have something to give' struck me, we have no excuses."

"I summed up the day - Generosity is a heart change that focuses on spreading the gospel, which results in thanksgiving and praising God."
